This is our latest newsletter updating you on site activities during the month of November.



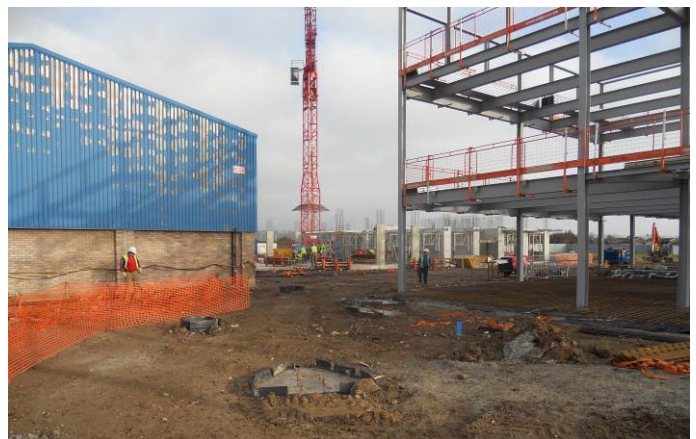
*Did you know?*

Skanska's site cabins are Eco-Cabins that include energy saving features such as enhanced insulation, double glazing, low energy light fittings, low wattage hand dryers and dual flush toilets.

This is all part of Skanska's drive to be the greenest constructor in the world.

- Works to break down the piles and form pile caps and ground beams have been completed to the Sports Hall, main entrance and teaching clusters. Foundations were also cast for the tower crane, enabling us to erect this at the end of September.
- The steel frame to the Sports Hall has been erected and is complete. The steel decking to form the first floor and roof areas will follow in November.
- All drainage to the Sports Hall has been installed and the ground floor slab is currently 60% complete.
- Brickwork and blockwork to the Sports Hall will commence in early November. You should see this brickwork completed by Christmas.
- The concrete frames of the two teaching clusters are progressing well with the Humanities Block currently at first floor level and the Science Block following just behind.
- Works during half term week whilst the children were away included new drainage runs and service ducts through the existing school entrance road, and surveys being carried out to the existing Sports Hall.
- The energy centre to the front of the existing school has progressed well with the steelwork complete, ground floor slab cast and brickwork/blockwork commenced. We're due to install plant to the energy centre in the new year.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your co-operation during this development, and we shall keep you informed in advance of our future planned works.
